
Our Humorist tonight was Tom Reilly, CTM and the Radar Person was Tracy Spinelli

When you finish the Competent Communicator Manual for the first time, you can choose two **FREE** advanced manuals. If you want to view which manuals you can choose from, please go over to the Simi Valley Toastmasters website, under the Newsletter page and view the May 7 2015 Newsletter.

After the (CC), you will need to work on two advanced manuals for the Advanced Communicator Bronze. (Each manual has 5 speeches)

After those manuals, you will purchase two different advanced manuals and do them, plus conduct two presentations from *The Better Speaker Series* and/or *The Successful Club Series*. That will get you to the Advanced Communicator Silver level.

For the Advanced Communicator Gold, you need to do two more advanced manuals, plus conduct two presentations from *The Better Speaker Series* and/or *The Successful Club Series*. Coach a new member with the first three speeches.

After each level that you complete, you can opt in to have Toastmasters International to send a certificate and a letter to your employer.

On page 66 of the Competent Communicator manual (**ABOUT YOUR CLUB**); there is a sample agenda, which explains how each meeting is formatted.

The pages 67 - 75 explain in more detail information about each role

Pages 76 - 78 describe the duties of each of the officer roles and pages 79 - 82 has **YOUR TOASTMASTERS SURVIVAL GUIDE**
